



NDOM REGULATION UPDATES


- State agencies required to review and update regulations every 10 years (NRS 233.050 (e))
- NDOM updated the following regulations in the past 2 years:
 - NAC 522 Oil and Gas, to include hydraulic fracturing and fees in 2014 and 2015
 - NAC 534A Geothermal Resources, including fees, in 2015
 - NAC 519A Reclamation bond pool, in 2014
 - NAC 517 Mining Claims, update of all forms, 2015
 - NAC 513 is final Chapter to be updated

ABANDONED MINE LANDS (AML) PROGRAM

- Statutory requirement to inventory and secure dangerous physical safety conditions resulting from historic mining operations: (NRS 513.094)
- Estimated 50,000 dangerous enough to cause injury or death, of which 19,365 have been logged, 15,685 secured
- Securing efforts by claimants, owners, and the agency address a public safety concern and assist the industry with receiving the necessary social license to operate
- The AML program in Nevada is a nationally recognized collaborative effort between the agency, federal land managers, claimants, property owners, and other stakeholders
- Statewide AML efforts and accomplishments are published in annual reports

- There were NO reported injuries or fatality reported in 2015! This is the second year in a row without an incident.




NDOM REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES, 2015

\$2,065,292






NDOM REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES, 2016



PROPOSED CHANGES TO NAC 513


- Increases 513.094 fee from \$2.50 to \$4.00/claim annually to fund AML program
- Allows Administrator to assign hazard rating under certain circumstances (NAC 513.330)
- Extends duty to secure a hazardous condition to owner
- Warning sign within 180 days for a dangerous condition ranked as minimal hazard (NAC 513.380)

PROPOSED CHANGES TO NAC 513

- Revises list of methods to secure hazard (NAC 513.390)
- Allows Administrator to approve modifications to securing site-specific features (NAC 513.390)
- Eliminates “fence” definition and requirement to post warning sign on “orange post” (NAC 513.260 and .370)

WHY IS THE \$1.50 INCREASE NEEDED?

- NDOM reserve has been depleted (end of year reserve of \$750,000 is required, current forecast below this at end of FY 2017)
- Number of claims has declined by 25% since 2008
- AML program is at a minimum, if we don't keep it funded we are not adhering to the statute
- 70% AML securing legislative performance measure
- NDOM AML expenditures/staffing have been reduced back to 2006 levels (4.8 fte's)
- There has not been an increase that funded NDOM AML activities since 1999
- Increase is 0.9% of annual claim holding fee
($\$1.50 / (\$155 \text{ BLM} + \$8.50 \text{ NDOM} + \$2 \text{ County}) = 0.9\%$)



\$1.50 fee increase impacts

- 163,542 claims for 2016 assessment year
- 1,968 entities hold claims
- 63% have 10 or fewer claims, average impact is \$5.39 per year per claimant
- 86 claimants are operating mining entities, average impact is \$1,240.24 per year
- \$1.50 increase expected to generate \$240,000 in FY 2017 (begins with 2017 assessment year)


Dear Governor Sandoval,

The Commission on Mineral Resources has a statutory duty under NRS 513.063 to advise and make recommendations to the Governor concerning policy relating to minerals. The Commission supports the 2014 Nevada Greater Sage-grouse Conservation Plan (State Plan) developed by the Sagebrush Ecosystem Program, including the Conservation Credit System.

The Commission has reviewed the Nevada and Northeastern California Greater Sage-Grouse Proposed Land Use Plan Amendment (LUPA) and Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), and has prepared a list of comments and recommendations for consideration in the Governor's consistency review. The Commission believes that the proposed land use plan is inconsistent with the Federal Land Policy and Management Act (FLPMA), The General Mining Law, and the State Sage-Grouse Conservation Plan. The Commission believes that the Governor should utilize all provisions under 43 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 1610.3-2 to ensure that the State Plan is appropriately incorporated in to the LUPA.




