### NEVADA EXCELLENCE IN MINE RECLAMATION AWARDS

- Awards Program began in 1991
- Purpose: "to recognize and share examples of successes in the areas of reclamation, closure, planning, and wildlife protection and enhancement in Nevada"
- Qualifications for an award:
  - Excellent mitigation of the environmental impacts of mineral industry activity
  - Work efforts which go above and beyond what is mandated
  - Worthy examples to share with others in the industry
- Awards require unanimous approval from Committee

**Award Category: Long-Term Mine Closure Reclamation** 





- ➤ Pre-State reclamation regulations with operations from 1986-1989
- Decades of coordination with USFS and State
- ➤ NDEP terminated the WPCP in 2019.
- ➤ The site is 100% regulatorily closed







- ➤ The revegetation is almost exclusively native plants giving a very natural look with the same wildlife habitat as the surroundings.
- ➤ Birch Creek is an important LCT stream and the overall reclamation has done well to date to minimize the impacts on Birch Creek and the LCT.







- > Partial backfill of the pit to avoid a pit lake effect
- > The waste rock dumps were largely left benched for stability reasons and not pushed down in order to impact the least amount of surrounding wildlife habitat.
- > Drainage structures were built to move run-off away from the crest of the bench
- No movement at the toe of the dumps has ever been observed.


➤ A 100-year 24-hour event ditch system to divert potential surface flow from the Toiyabe Range.

Removal of all equipment, tanks, and process components was completed in 1996.



## Newcrest Mining Limited Jarbidge Exploration Project



- Significant forethought into reclamation
- Exploration project in high mountain environment with lots of challenges including threatened Bull Trout
- Constant coordination with USFS and local community

## Newcrest Mining Limited Jarbidge Exploration Project

- > Major efforts went into protecting the wildlife in the area
- ➤ Water hose and erosion control devices installed along the length of the temporary exploration roads

- ➤ Upon request by the USFS, to reduce surface disturbance Newcrest acquired out-of-state core rigs that created a smaller footprint.
- > Also, the rigs needed to have class-1 airshed engines on the rigs.

HLP 2021



- New company to Nevada and recently acquired project
- ➤ Initiated voluntarily improvements for both environmental quality and increase reclamation efforts

HLP 2023



- > Developed immediate proactive and innovative approaches to addressing these multiple legacy issues
- > Design evaporation basins on the heap leach pad (HLP) for better fluid management results
- Within one-year, significant results have occurred for reducing fluid encapsulation on the HLP.

Before



➤ Pathfinder went back to pre-regulatory waste rock storage faculties (WRSF) that had been re-graded in the early 2000's that had "burned" vegetation areas due to sulfide rock types exposed at the surface after the re-grading effort was completed.




- > The WRSF were never released from the reclamation permit.
- ➤ Pathfinder took the voluntary initiative to place alluvial cover on the "hot spots" to encourage future revegetation success.
