POSITION OPEN TO:

This is an open competitive recruitment, open to all qualified applicants. This position is appointed by, and serves at the pleasure of, the Division Administrator.

AGENCY RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Division of Minerals mission is to encourage and assist in the responsible exploration for and the production of minerals, oil, gas, and geothermal energy which are economically beneficial to the State, to provide for public safety by identifying, ranking and securing dangerous conditions at mines that are no longer operating, and collecting and disseminating information on exploration, production and related topics. The seven-member Commission on Mineral Resources is a public body appointed by the Governor and directs mineral-related policy for the Division and advises the Governor and Legislature on matters relating to mineral resources. The Division focuses its efforts on three main areas: Industry relations and public affairs; regulation of oil, gas, and geothermal drilling activities and well operations; and abandoned mine lands. APPROXIMATE ANNUAL SALARY: \$57,675 to \$81,413* per year

1. Provide support to the Chief, Abandoned Mine Lands (AML) Program in planning and prioritization of fieldwork, data entry and evaluation, and timely responses to public and industry inquiries.
2. Perform inventory and ownership research of, and public safety securing work at, abandoned mine features located throughout the state.
3. Assist with the training and field supervision of up to eight AML interns.
4. Provide classroom and public presentations informing the public of the hazards posed by abandoned mine features and on the uses and importance of minerals in society.
5. Provide support, and act as backup, to the Fluid Minerals Program Manager in the processing of oil, gas, geothermal and dissolved mineral resource exploration well permits and performance of well inspections and witnessing of drilling operations.
6. Utilize digital field tablets and ArcGIS to create/update maps and geodatabases supportive of the AML, Fluid Minerals, and Education/Outreach programs.
7. Represent the Division at various mineral industry trade shows and public outreach events.
8. Other duties as requested by the Administrator.

The position will require fieldwork, the ability to hike over rough and uneven terrain carrying supplies of 40 pounds or more, and extensive statewide and overnight travel.

TO QUALIFY:

The position requires a minimum of a four-year degree from an accredited, non-correspondence college or university in the earth sciences (geology, geological engineering, mining engineering, geography, hydrology, or related fields). A valid US driver's license is required. This position is subject to a pre-employment drug test. Work experience in the mining, oil/gas or geothermal industry will be considered advantageous, as will practical experience with remote sensing data and drones. Proficiency with ArcGIS and Microsoft Office, including Access, is necessary.
